

11+ Testing Consortium of Herschel Grammar School, Langley Grammar School, St Bernard's Catholic Grammar School and Upton Court Grammar School

Information on 2015 entry

The 11+ test is designed to identify pupils who would be suited to a grammar school education. A score of 111 or greater means that a pupil is **eligible to be considered** for a place in a grammar school if they were to apply.

If a grammar school is oversubscribed – ie has more applicants than it has places available – places will be offered according to the criteria set out in the individual school's Admissions Policy. A score of 111 in itself is therefore **not** a guarantee of a place.

Parents should be aware that the four grammar schools have different criteria under which they will offer places if they are oversubscribed. This may involve offering places in rank order, according to distance from the school, or some other criteria. Parents <u>must</u> check the admissions policy of each school, and address any questions they may have to the school concerned.

The following information relates to the 11+ testing round in September 2014 and consequent entry to the schools in September 2015.

² If the school is named anywhere on the Common Application Form, this counts as an application irrespective of the applicant's 11+ score.

³ This is the number of applicants who achieved an average standardised score of 111 or above in the Consortium 11+ test. These applicants were eligible for consideration for a place.
