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The week in review

- ⇒ Aa small team of Year 7 students went to the Royal Berkshire Show, Design Make and Market Competition at the Berkshire College of Agriculture last Friday. Their idea was to produce a template for making a small card box, (e.g. Amazon packaging) which could be used for seeds, saplings and small plants to grow in, and then be directly planted in the ground where it would decompose. There were 8 other groups participating - all older than our students, with some from the college and others who were taking A Level Design and Technology. Students had to talk informally to the judges and then give a formal presentation to the whole room. Our team won joint second place and will receive for the school £100 for the entry and £100 for 2nd place. Well done to all involved!
- ⇒ Year 10 GCSE Geography students have been on a fieldwork visit to Slapton in Devon on Tuesday. This is them at their starting point about to begin their coastal fieldwork day studying geographical features, processes and management.
- ⇒ This year's *cricket season* has been decimated thanks to the British weather. We finally got a game in on Wednesday, as the Year 8 boys cricket kick-started their league campaign with a win against Slough and Eton after successfully chasing down 57. A really good bowling and fielding performance as a team set the tone for the day which saw them beat a team they lost to last season. Well done to the team a very good start!

- ⇒ **Year 10 students** will depart for the **Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award Practice Expedition** to the Chilterns on Wednesday and will return on Friday.
- ⇒ A reminder to parents that *Monday 29th May* until *Friday 2nd June* is *half term* and school is closed to students.

There are a lot of activities coming up over the first two weeks after the half term break.....

- ⇒ The History and Geography Departments have organised visits for students in Year 7 on two days in June. On Wednesday 7 June 7C, 7S and 7V will be visiting the Chiltern Hills to assess the impact of the High Speed 2 rail line, whilst students from 7H, 7K and 7R will be visiting Warwick Castle as part of a History fieldtrip. On Thursday 15 June the groups will reverse, so that all students attend both activities.
- ⇒ Some of our keen cricketers will have the opportunity to watch Middlesex vs Sussex in the Vitality T20 Blast County Cricket Championship being held at Lords on Thursday 8th June. The PE department will send a letter home shortly.
