During this year we have developed a pattern of termly *Celebration Assemblies*, which took place this week for all year groups. *Over 650 certificates* were issued to students for their outstanding commitment to specific subjects or to extracurricular activities. During the assemblies we encouraged students to listen carefully to the reasons *why* the certificates were being given. Students were being commended for their commitment, their attitude towards their learning and their engagement in lessons, for example as confident communicators or by showing creativity and independence in their work. The aim is to emphasise to students that if you get your basic attitude and approach to the subject right, then academic success will follow.

In his role as part of our Individual Needs team, Mr Batsman led informative assemblies on *neurodiversity* last week. These included thought-provoking and reflective comments from some of our neurodivergent students, such as those with autism or ADHD, on how they feel and what other students can do to help them feel equal and included.
