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### The week in review

- ⇒ Congratulations to Sami, Ayman and Satvik from *Team Daytona* following the *Digital Schoolhouse Super Smash Bros Grand Final* last Friday at BAFTA London and huge thanks to the supporters too! A fantastic effort but unfortunately beaten at the final hurdle to become *National Grand Final Runners Up*. An exhilarating and nail biting experience for all! Congratulations also to *Karim* who won the shoutcasting competition with his knowledge of the game, quick wit and banter on the microphone.
- ⇒ Nine students from our under 14s **Robotics Team** represented LGS at the RAF Hendon in the shadow of some of the worlds finest historical aircraft. Students took part in speed tests, employed a distance sensor and built a parachute. This followed by two rounds of a robot game board where they completed challenges using sensors and motors using our Spike Prime Robot.
- ⇒ On Wednesday, Year 12 **Young Enterprise** company "Sleep Serene" represented the school at the area finals at O2 headquarters in Slough. This was a highly competitive field including teams from St George's Ascot, Burnham and Herschel Grammar Schools and Langley Academy. Sleep Serene presented first to the industry judges and were awarded the "**Best Marketing Award**".
- ⇒ On Wednesday, we hosted the inaugural 3 x 3 Basketball Championships in association with local club, Thames Valley Cavaliers. This was a great opportunity for our students to receive high quality coaching in a rapidly growing sport and all four LGS mixed teams progressed to the quarter finals. LGS 2 went on to win the final, and will go on to the Berkshire School Games later this term! Well done to all involved!
- ⇒ Former LGS student *Jarnail Atwal* delivered an inspiring lecture to Year 12. Jarnail left LGS in 2018 to study PPE at Oxford and now works in the civil service currently for DEFRA and shortly to move to the foreign office. Students were given a snapshot into the day of a civil servant and set a policy making discussion task on improving air quality.

This weekend sees the first Coronation ceremony for 70 years.
