Dear Parents

As we approach the half term break we can look back at another busy half term. 


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The week in review

- ⇒ Students from are taking part in our Year 7-9 production of 'Bugsy' had a great time at the Troubadour Theatre, Wembley Park on Thursday afternoon. They saw 'Newsies' a musical with amazing dancing, singing and thrilling overall energy.
