



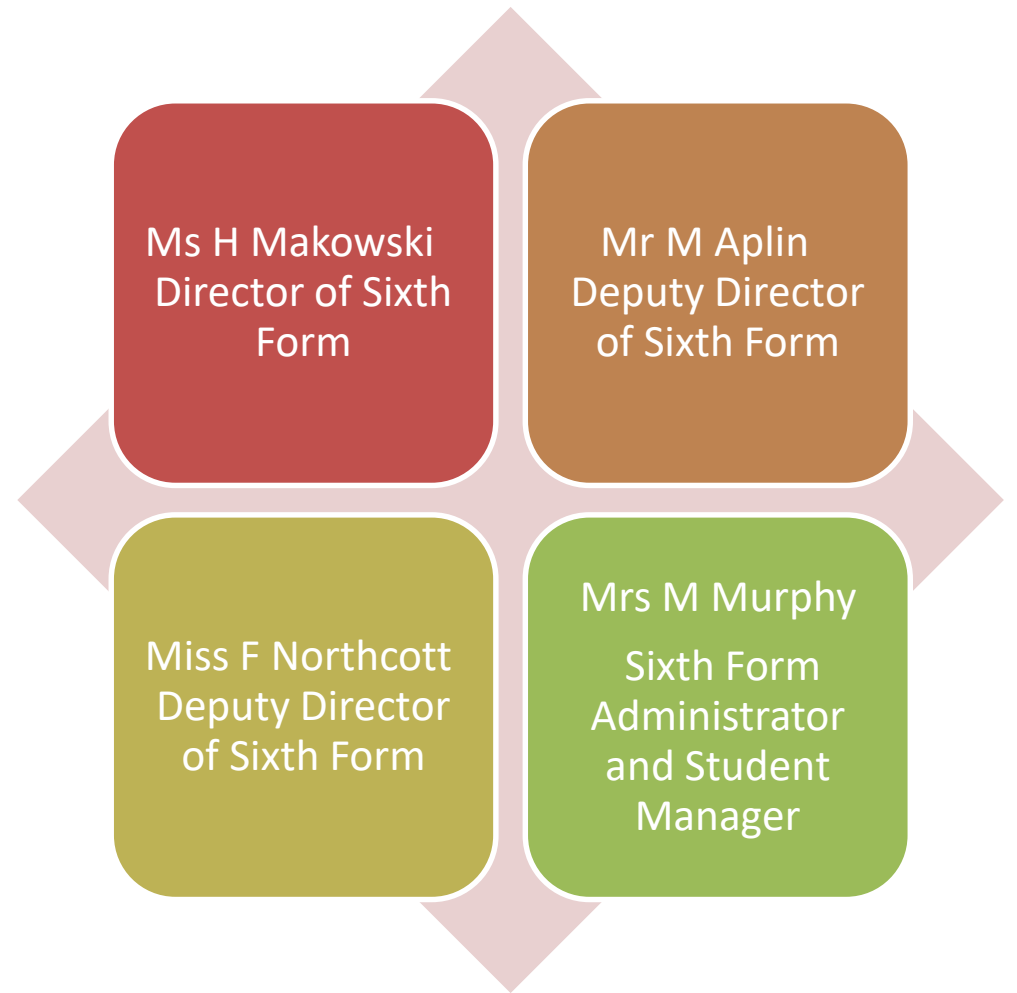

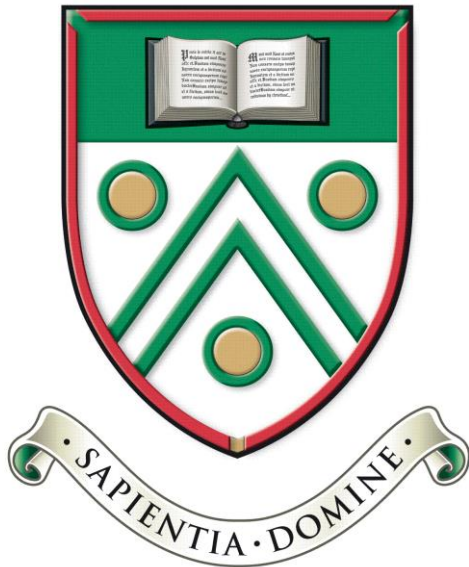

Over 57% of grades were awarded A* or A

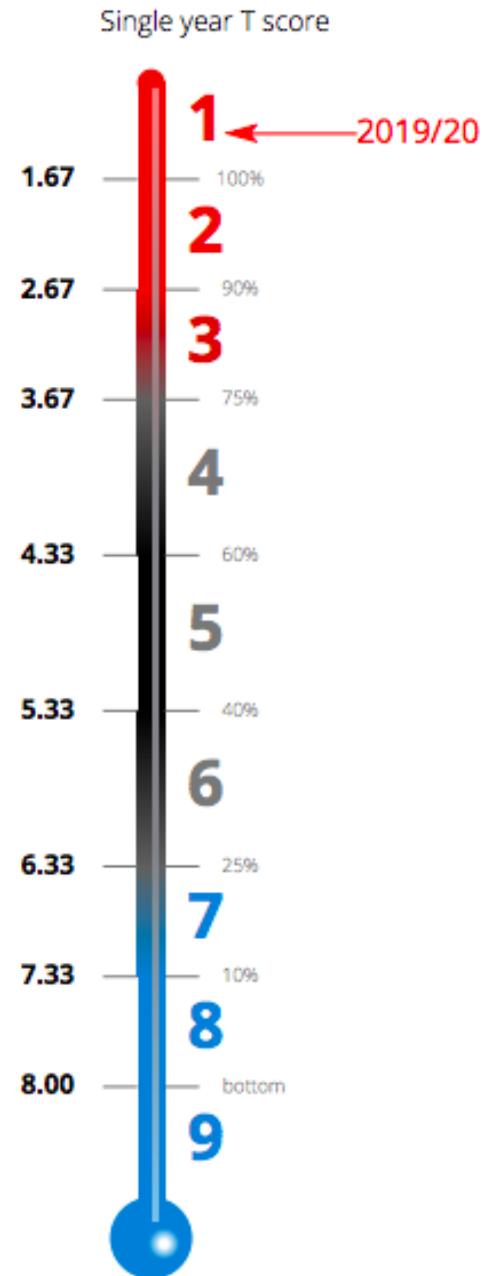
50% of the destinations were to Russell Group universities

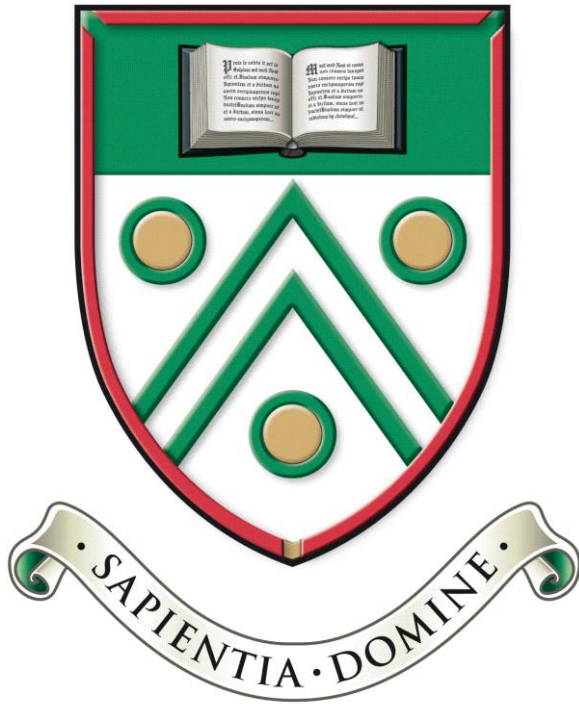
62% of the destinations were to the top 40 universities

- show evidence of their academic interests outside the specification



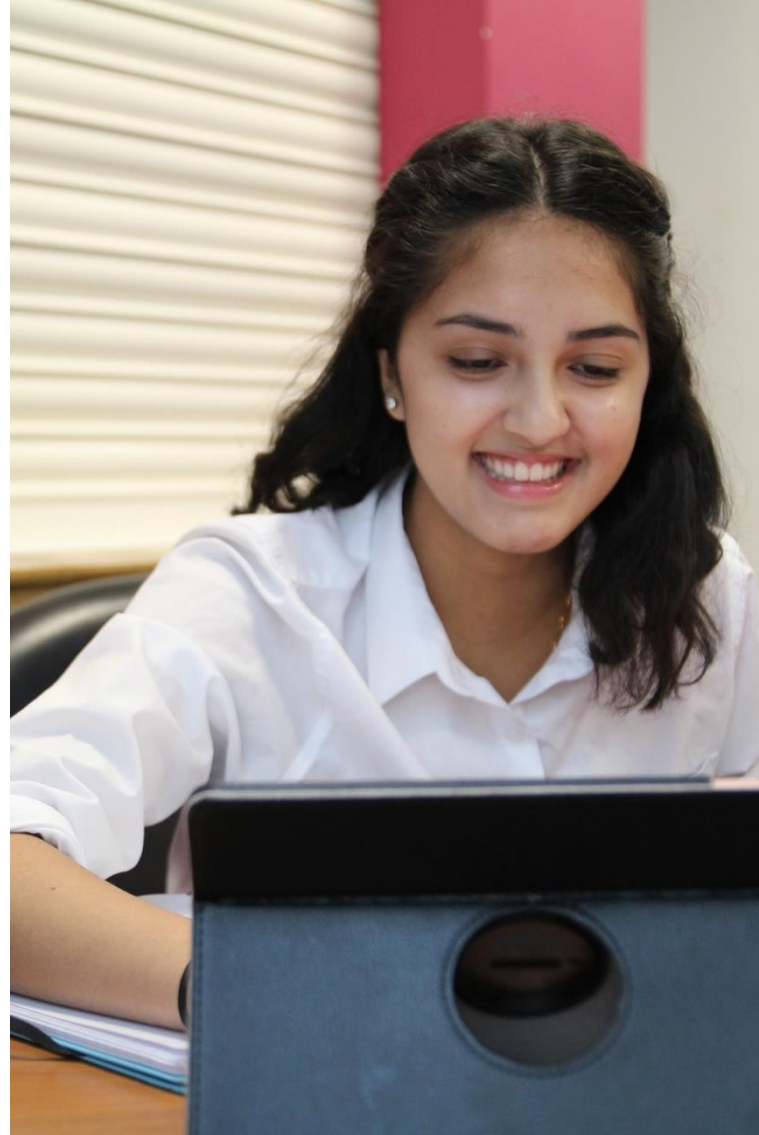

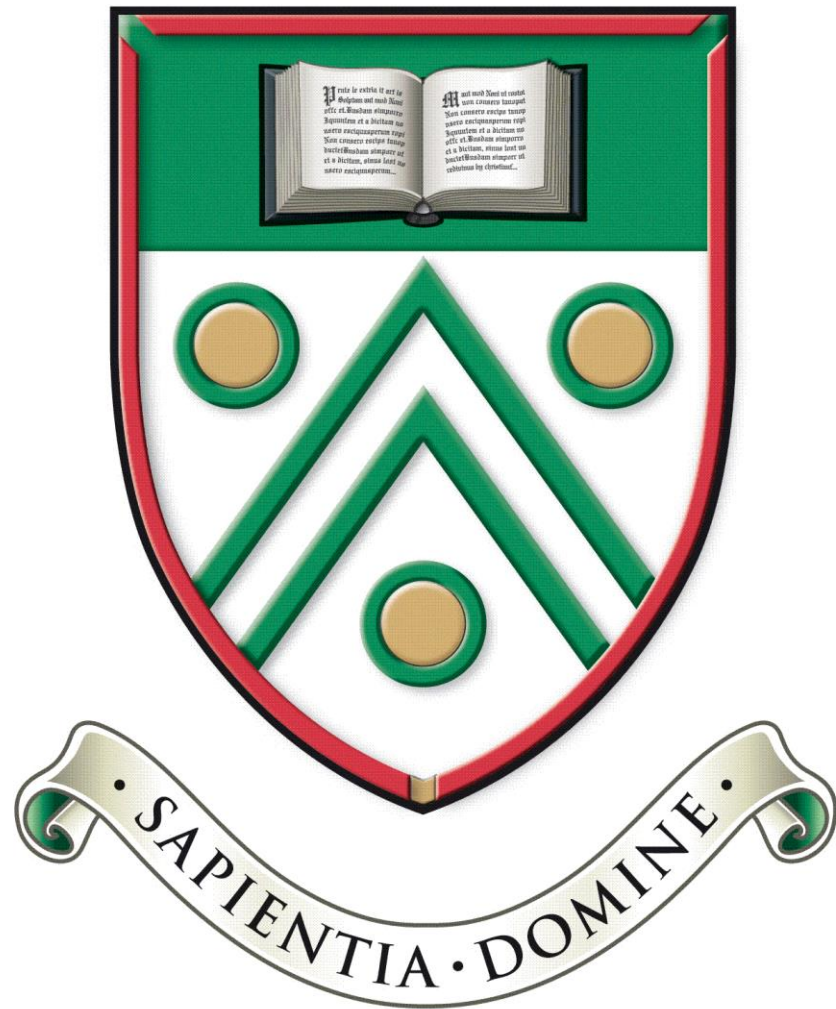


The Curriculum: Enrichment Courses

Academic admissions Criteria

- Average GCSE points score of 5.5 or above
- GCSE Maths and English at grade 5 or above.
- Subject specific requirements (Course Guide)



Study Programmes

Average point score **5.5-5.9** - ***eligible to study 3 A Levels*** and a compulsory enrichment course.

Average point score **6.0 or above** - **expected to study 4 A Levels** and an optional enrichment course.

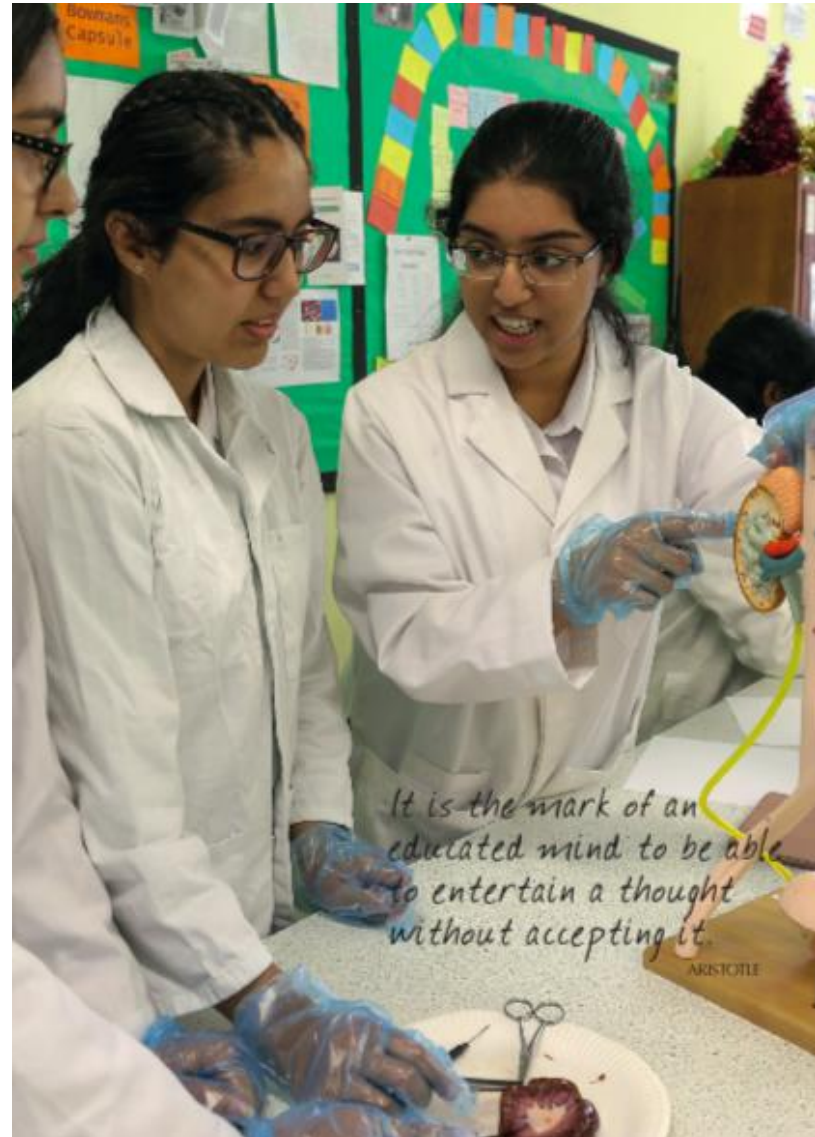
Further Mathematics may only be taken as a fourth A Level.



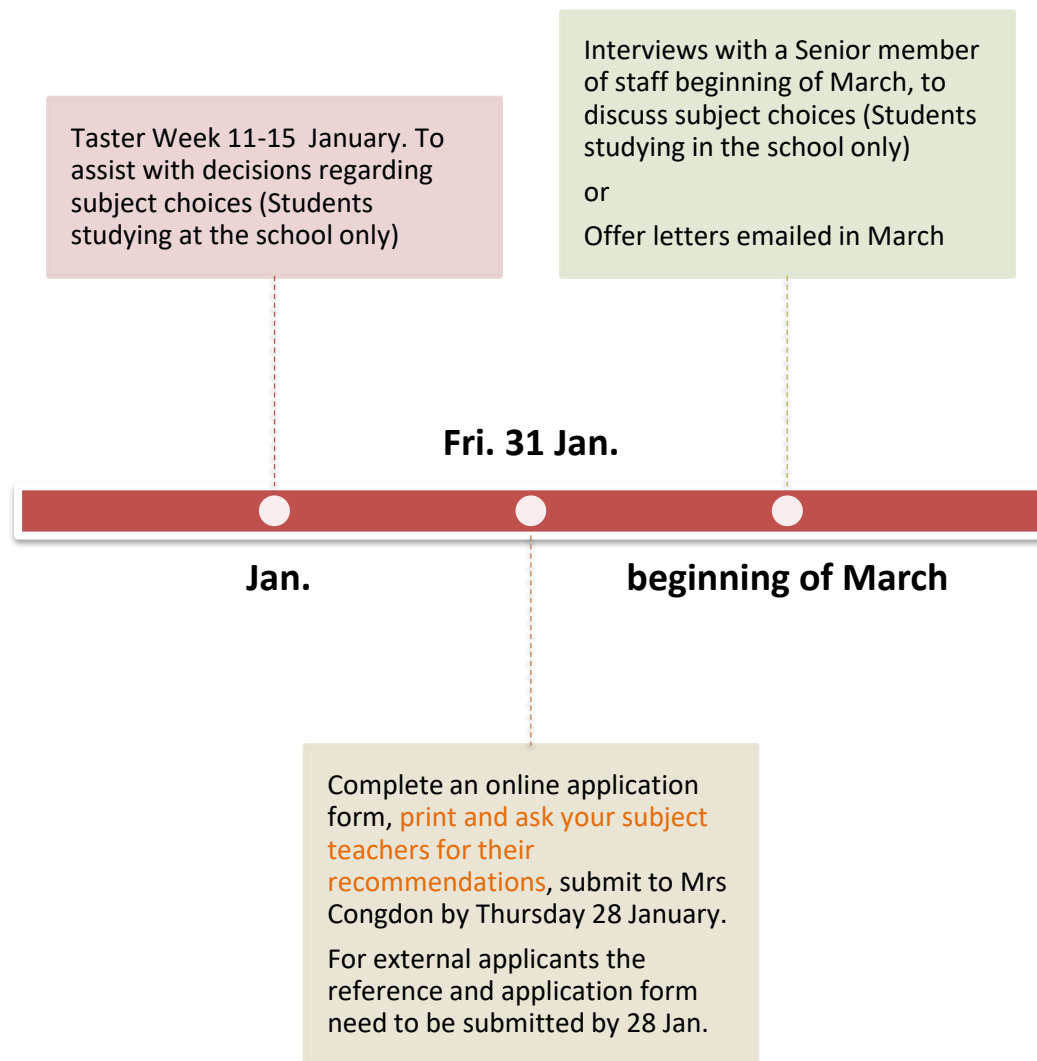
NB Courses will run subject to sufficient numbers

Subject Specific Entry Criteria

- Grade 6 for most subjects
- **Maths and Sciences** – need Grade 7 at GCSE single science or 7,7 in Combined Science.
- **Further Maths** requires GCSE Maths grade 8
- **Economics and Sociology** - grade 6 in English.
- **Psychology** - grade 6 in English and Science.

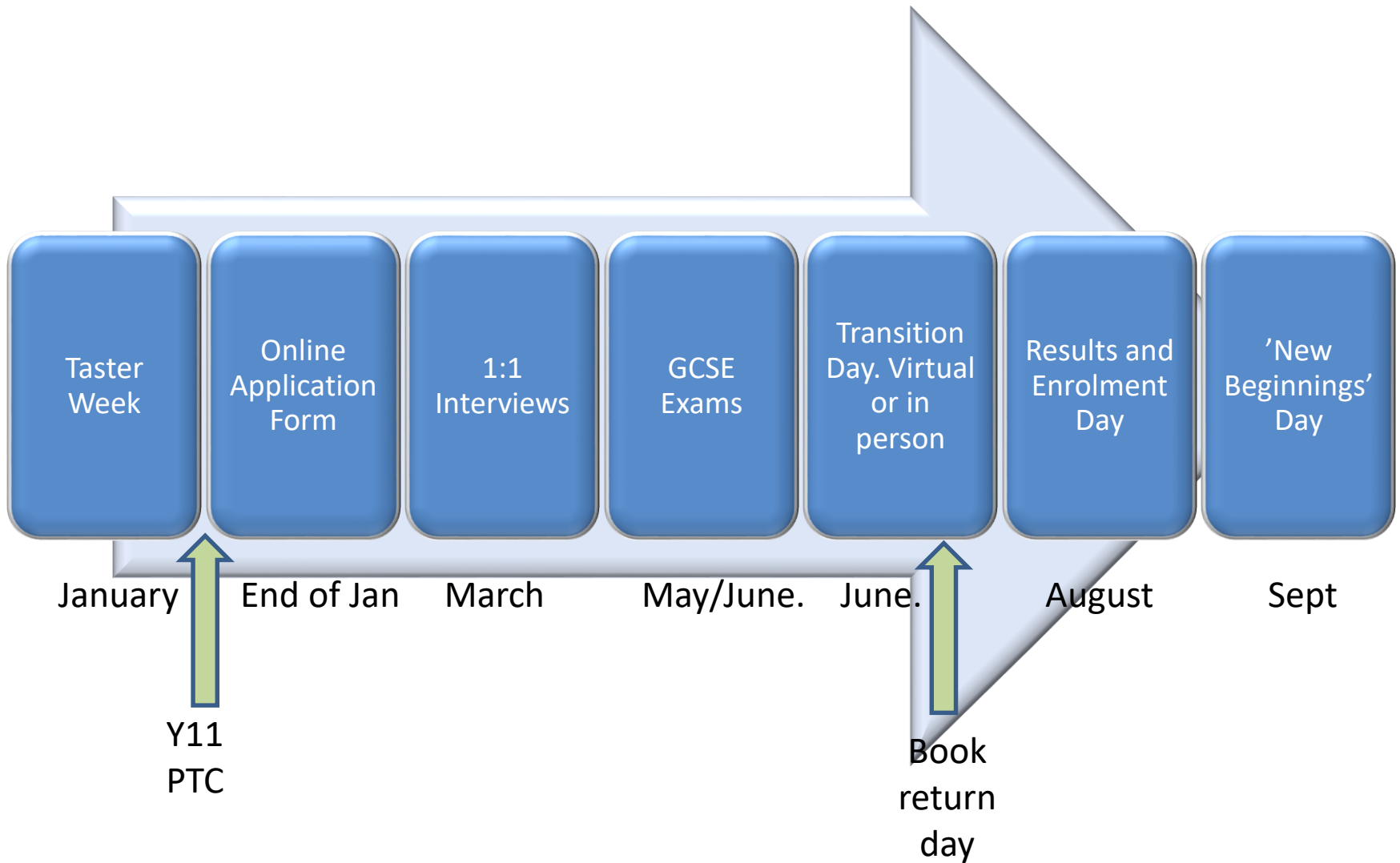
