


Academic admissions criteria

Average GCSE points score of 5.5 or above

GCSE Maths and English at grade 5 or above.

Subject specific requirements (see Course Guide)



Study Programmes

Average GCSE point score....

5.5 - 5.9

 eligible to study 3 A Levels and a compulsory enrichment course.

6.0 or above

 expected to study 4 A Levels and an optional enrichment course.

Further Mathematics may only be taken as a <u>fourth</u> A Level.



Courses will run subject to sufficient numbers

Subjectspecific entry criteria

Grade 6 for most subjects

Maths and Sciences – need Grade 7 at GCSE single science or 7,7 in Combined Science.

Further Maths requires GCSE Maths grade 8

Economics and **Sociology** - grade 6 in English.

Psychology - grade 6 in English and Science.



Admission Process

Pre-GCSEs

Taster Week 08-12 January. To assist with decisions regarding subject choices

(Current LGS students only)

Interviews with a senior member of staff beginning of March, to discuss subject choices

(Current LGS students only)

Offer letters emailed in March

Complete an online application form, submit to online by Thursday 18 January.

For external applicants the reference and application form need to be submitted by 26 Jan.


