Just a reminder that we use two main systems to keep in contact with you.....

SIMS InTouch allows us to contact you by text or email, either individually or by cohort (eg Parents of Year 9) The system takes information *directly from our school database* of parental contacts.

SIMS Parent App provides you with access to information about your child straight from your smartphone, tablet or computer.

You can use the Parent App to access attendance information, your child's timetable, conduct alerts and totals, and previous reports. You can also use the app to update the personal information we hold about your child, and your contact details.

Buildings update

2018 exam results



GCSEs

Students at Langley Grammar School have achieved a very encouraging set of results in the 2018 GCSE examinations.

Most students took examinations in Maths, English Language and Literature, Biology, Chemistry and Physics, Philosophy & Ethics, French or German, together with three other optional courses. They had already taken an iGCSE in Information Technology when in Year 9. Some students also took an additional qualification in Mathematics.

This is the second year of the reformed GCSEs in English and Mathematics, but the first set of results in the new, more challenging courses, for most other subjects. Reformed courses are graded from 9 down to 1. A small number of subjects – notably Business Studies, Product Design, Textiles and Classical Civilisation – were still on unreformed specifications, graded A* down to G.

151 students sat a total of 1651 examinations in May/June 2018

150 students (99.4%) gained at least Grade 5s in <u>both</u> English and Maths

Overall, 68.4% of the results were grades 9-7, A* or A

24.5% of entries for the reformed subjects were awarded the highest grade 9

A Levels

Against the background of the continuing rollout of reformed A Level examinations, Year 13 students at Langley Grammar School maintained the school's high standards with another set of excellent results.

In 2018, students were examined in the new reformed specifications in almost all subjects, with the only major exceptions being Maths and Product Design. For nearly half the subjects, this was the first set of results for the new courses.

A total of 148 students in last year's Year 13 sat over 460 examinations between them.

Overall, 71.3% of the grades were A*-B, with 35% at A* or A.

28 students (19%) gained A* or A grades across all their subjects.

Provisional analysis indicates that Langley Grammar School students **made far better progress** made from GCSE to A Level than most students of their ability. We are one **of the top schools in the country** for the value added during the two years of the Sixth Form.

Examination results tell a significant part of the story, but over their time in the Sixth Form our students achieved more than simply a good set of grades. Alongside their A Level subjects they took part in a wide range of additional activities and experiences and contributed to the school and local community.

We supported them to be much more than a 'walking set of exam certificates' and to leave the school as young men and women who are
