**Dear Parents** 

Half way through the summer term already - and a shame that the weather hasn't caught up with it yet!

There is a real and welcome sense of 'normality' about this term so far. Our staff are very busy, but this is largely with the activities we would normally be engaged in during this part of the school year. We have a full programme of extracurricular activities back up and running, a drama production in preparation and plans in place for things like a proper Sports Day and our next Focus Day. Of course, there has been an additional layer of activity this year as we have been preparing Year 11 and 13 students for examinations.

After two years without any public examinations, the GCSEs and A Levels are going ahead as normal, although with some adjustments to the assessment to take into account the impact of the pandemic. We took the opportunity to thank all members of our school staff for their hard work and to the academic and personal development of our students, whether that is working directly with them, or with our administrative systems which help keep the school functioning effectively. I am sure you are grateful for the dedication of our staff to your children's education.

As we move in to the last section of the school year there will be opportunities for students to reflect on what they have learned and how they have developed though this year,. We those in Years 7-10 and 12 well as they complete their studies for this year and look forward to being able to celebrate their achievements and successes towards the end of the term.

## **Online safety**

#### Supporting online safety

The long-awaited Online Safety Bill is now working its way through Parliament. The intention is to put in place new online safety laws for tech companies whilst bringing in a 'new era of accountability' online.

Student internet use in school is heavily controlled because of the school's firewall and filtering software. However, we know that outside the school day students may often have significant access to the online world via their phones or other devices.

The breadth of issues classified within online safety is considerable, but can be categorised into four areas of risk:

**content:** being exposed to illegal, inappropriate or harmful content, for example: pornography, fake news, racism, misogyny, self-harm, suicide, anti-Semitism, radicalisation and extremism.

**contact:** being subjected to harmful online interaction with other users; for example: peer to peer pressure, commercial advertising and adults posing as children or young adults with the intention to groom or exploit them for sexual, criminal, financial or other purposes'.

**conduct:** personal online behaviour that increases the likelihood of, or causes, harm; for example, making, sending and receiving explicit images (e.g consensual and non-consensual sharing of nudes and semi-nudes and/or pornography, sharing other explicit images and online bullying; and

**commerce:** risks such as online gambling, inappropriate advertising, phishing and or financial scams.

## **Online safety**

Most of our students understand the risks associated with online apps, games and social media platforms. However, we also know that young people are being contacted in their own homes on online platforms and apps and asked for sexual pictures and videos, while their parents and carers believe they are safe.

More and more sexual abuse material is being created by offenders who coerce and groom children into sexual activities, often in children's own bedrooms and bathrooms. The criminals then record this via webcams or livestreaming services. It's known as 'self-generated' child sexual abuse imagery.

Since the start of the pandemic, the amount of 'self-generated' child abuse imagery has increased dramatically. In 2020, the Internet Watch Foundation confirmed 68,000 cases of such imagery, a rise of 77% on the year before. It accounts for nearly half (44%) the imagery the IWF took action on last year. In 80% of these cases, the victims were 11- to 13-year-old girls.

This is happening now, and it can happen to anyone. But you can do something about it and can help prevent it happening to your child.

The Internet Watch Foundation has developed material to help parents engage in conversation with their children about staying safe online. This includes a resource to help parents understand the risks of 'self-generated child sexual abuse imagery' using the acronym 'TALK'.



## **Online safety**

Most of the popular social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age before they can register.

The age requirements are there because of data protection laws. Online services are not allowed to collect or store children's personal information if they are under the age of 13. Data protection laws also say that only children aged 13 and over can sign up to online services without parental permission.
