- ⇒ **Students in Year 9** had a virtual assembly from **Pathway CTM**, an organisation which helps connect young people, schools & parents with leading global brands. provide employability skills training, free careers events, and work experience & apprenticeship opportunities. - ⇒ The first of two groups of **Year 9** students had an exciting field studies visit to **Iceland**. Despite some 'interesting' weather at the start they experienced a range of activities exploring the natural features of the island. A great trip!
- ⇒ We hosted *The Stage-Ed theatre company* who performed key scenes from Macbeth to *Year 8* students. The actors then encouraged students to ask questions and debate the impact of free will and fate on Macbeth's decisions. Finally, students had the opportunity to revise some context information to help them prepare for their assessment.
- ⇒ Around 200 *parents* joined our first online *Parent Forum* to hear our safeguarding leads talk about online risks and how to support keeping children safe as they navigate the online world. Thank you for attending we hope you found it helpful.
- ⇒ **Year 7 and 8** students had lots of fun making their own disappearing ink in **Chemistry Club**. They wrote secret messages to each other and then carefully revealed their messages using heat!
- ⇒ **Year 12** students spoke to a range of professionals during our careers **Speed Networking event**. We were joined by over 30 representatives from a range of organisations and businesses, including former LGS students.

Updates & Reminders

- ⇒ Year 9 PTC is taking place online on Monday 6th February. As usual on PTC days we will be changing the timings of the school day for students in all year groups; lunchtime and period 5 will each be reduced by 10 minutes and the school day will end at 2.55pm. If you normally pick your child up from school, please would you note and ensure they are picked up promptly at the earlier time? As teachers are involved in the PTC, we are not able to provide on-site activities and supervision after the end of the school day.

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Looking ahead

- ⇒ Our second group of **Year 9 students** will travelling to **Iceland** for a visit from Tuesday to Friday. We hope they have a very enjoyable trip!
- ⇒ Our first *Parents' Coffee Morning* event is taking place on *Wednesday 8th February*. This is an informal opportunity to come in to school and talk face to face with members of our Safeguarding team, and broaden their knowledge of the online risks facing students.
- ⇒ Next week sees the return of large-scale music, drama and other performance with our Senior House Variety Competition. Students across Years 10-13 will be performing in a House competition designed to showcase the best acting and musical talents in their year groups. Prior to the pandemic restrictions, our House music and drama competitions were always a highlight of the school year and it is good to see these opportunities being re-established in a new and updated form.
- ⇒ Next week is also Children's Mental Health Week. There will be assemblies to raise awareness of the importance of positive mental health and how to support those who may be experiencing mental health difficulties.



Why are some teachers striking?

Earlier this week the National Education Union held the first of a number of strikes planned for this term. On this occasion, a small number of teachers at LGS decided to take strike action, as is their right. However, the impact on the school was minimal and we remained open for all year groups. The NEU has further strikes planned for the 2nd, 15th and 16th of March; we will keep you informed as to the likely impact on the school.

The central issue is teachers' pay, which has fallen significantly in real terms since 2010 when inflation is taken into account. Although there was a pay rise for teachers in September 2022, this was significantly below the current rate of inflation, and follows a number years where there have been minimal pay increases, or even pay freezes within the public sector. School leaders are concerned that the Government has not directly funded the most recent pay increases in 2022, leading to further pressure on school budgets at a time of significantly increasing energy costs.

School leaders are concerned that workload pressures, poor pay progression and underfunding of schools in general are making it increasingly difficult to recruit and retain a sufficient quantity and quality of teachers. Ultimately this could have serious detrimental consequences for children and young people.
